Renowned Criminologist, Professor Edmond Locard, believed that any time a person came in contact with an object, evidence of that contact was left behind. This came to be known as Locard's Exchange Principle, and it helped change the way crime was investigated in the 20th Century. In the 21st Century, this principle is more relevant than ever. Almost everything a person does on a computer leaves a trace — a trace that can often be used as evidence.

More and more, the digital traces we leave behind are being used as evidence in civil litigations. Intellectual property, fraud, negligence, employee disputes, divorce...any type of case can involve digital evidence.

Files that have been deleted are often recoverable. Disk space that has been formatted can often be restored. Information that has been embedded within images or non-related documents in an effort to conceal its content can often be extracted and examined. Documents. Spreadsheets. Email. Chat logs. Digital pictures. Web browsing history. All of this data and more can potentially be recovered.
